## From The Pastor's Desk . . .

Dear Friends,

After the blizzards of 2010 and the realization that a little bit of the snow still continues to remind us of a difficult winter, we journey toward the gift of Easter. I was wondering whether there aren't some images of recent winter events that might speak to our Lenten journey.

First of all, whether we liked it or not, we were snowbound. Our schedules changed dramatically as meetings were cancelled and obligations could not be met. We were no longer in control of our schedule but had to accept the inconvenience of lives disrupted. Many told me that they actually found those days especially fruitful as they saw God from a different perspective. The snow was really beautiful, and we were reminded of the way God speaks to us through nature. The increased quiet time allowed us to think about the more important things. Not running from thing to thing gave us an opportunity to reflect on the bigger picture and where God fits into our daily lives. While the snow disrupted many lives immeasurably, I really found those days to be peaceful and full of grace, and an opportunity to think about God's place in my life.

As the snow is now almost all melted, another image comes to mind. Lent allows us to thaw the hardness of heart that comes throughout the year. As the snow melts and disappears, I would like to hope that we can melt away the distractions of everyday life and let our hearts burn more strongly with the love of Jesus. The Church gives us three "tools" to achieve that goal: almsgiving, prayer and fasting. Let these tools be a "shovel" to push away the distractions and open the warmth of your heart to the wonder of Jesus.

### Visit Your Parish Library

The recent Sunday morning lecture given by John Haughey, S.J. brought to the parish once again an ecumenist, winner of the Monika K. Hellwig Award for outstanding contributions to Catholic intellectual life, former professor of religious ethics at Loyola University, Chicago, and associate editor for America magazine. Father Haughey's books are constantly in demand and shed light on many of the problems which surface in contemporary society. Among them are the following:

The Conspiracy of God: the Holy Spirit in Men (236 H183 C657). In this stimulating volume Father Haughey points out the different types of spirituality and suggests a 'spirituality of the future'. He does this by examining the various ways the Holy Spirit has manifested itself from the time of Jesus to the present. What is the special nature of the Spirit? You will find this 'conspiracy' probing and demanding.

The Faith that Does Justice: examining the Christian sources for social change (362 H183 F147). Father Haughey has edited a book of essays which invite us to consider the historical foundations of justice in our faith. The first essay in Part I, by Avery Dulles, sets this theme: 'The Meaning of Faith Considered in Relationship to Justice'. Part II, 'The Tradition Plumbed', gives some biblical and historical perspectives; Part III, 'New Directions Envisaged', includes an essay 'Jesus as the Justice of God' by Father Haughey; it traces the roots of social justice in the Gospels and shows how awareness of these roots has increased over the years.

The Holy Use of Money: Personal Finances in Light of Christian Faith (261.85 H29 H65). How do we reconcile the spiritual and material spheres of our lives? 'By steeping ourselves in the mysteries of Christ we begin to see God's purpose in history. We also begin to see God's intentions for our economic system—a system that should express our spirituality, our humanity, our freedom'.

The Parish Council further discuss the Centennial plans of the parish. Additional events were placed on the calendar and some dates were changed. The Centennial Committee reported that the parish Gala date has been set for October 8, 2011 at Strathmore. The date of the parish picnic will be determined before the next Council meeting. In addition, members agreed that the parish picnic will be in addition to, not instead of, the annual Gym Mass picnic. The Council discussed the possibility of using certain Centennial activities to raise funds for other Centennial events or raise funds for the much-needed rectory renovation. The Parish Council will ask and assist the commissions to create a quick summary of accomplishments, goals and plans which will be used by the next commission chairs (who will lead beginning in September 2010). The Council further discussed the long-term strategic planning ideas presented in January by the Administration Commission. Further evaluation will take place prior to the next Council meeting.

The Commission discussed the seven events being recommended for the Centennial in 2011, including 1) a Family Mass and Mission Fair (fall); 2) a Tridentine Mass on March 8; 3) the Mass celebrating Corpus Christi with Archbishop Wuerl on June 19; 4) an end-of-year Christmas sing-a-long event; 5) rebinding of the parish's Sacramental books; 6) the commissioning of a new hymn for the parish; and 7) possible new art or architecture for the church.
