## Readings • Easter Sunday

### First Reading: Acts Of The Apostles 10:34a, 37-43

Peter addresses a "homily" to Cornelius, the centurion who is led to Peter, and to faith, by a vision. Peter obeys the divine injunction to teach this man (Gentile and outsider though he is) the Good News about Christ Jesus. Christ was dead, but now he lives forever.

### Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

There are two options for the Epistle reading. This one, from Colossians, is a reminder that we who have been baptized in Christ have died with him. One day we will share in his Resurrection, as well. For now, while this new life remains "hidden" in God, we must live in a new way, with our thoughts fixed on Christ, where he lives with God.

### Sequence: Victimae Paschali Laudes

Today we praise our "Paschal Victim" in an ancient song that speaks of the triumph of Christ.

### Gospel: John 20:1-9

In this account there is no angel, no soldiers, only the empty tomb and burial cloths. Mary of Magdala comes first, and thinks that the Lord's body has been stolen. Peter and the beloved disciple run to the tomb, the beloved arrives first and stops at the entrance, Peter goes in. Each disciple seems to lead the other deeper into faith.

**Chimes Chatter** — We last discussed "action machines"; how about a closer look. Each machine is a solenoid assembly which drives ("slides") a central horizontal rod or "hammer." A solenoid is coiled wire around a core that becomes energized to create engineered magnetic fields. We have both strike solenoids and retract solenoids. This hammer consists of four major pieces: head, tip, bronze half-rod and steel remaining half of same

rod. The hammer's head is steel about five inches long (two-inch diameter). The strike end has a tightly coiled rawhide insert (tip) that actually strikes (contacts) the respective chime tube. The eighteen-inch long (one-inch diameter) drive rod is made of two metal-bonded pieces. The head-end piece is of bronze (does not magnetize). The end opposite the head is of steel (which magnetizes). The steel part is acted upon by solenoids to first drive the "slide" hammer against the chime tube and then retract. When the hammer is retracted, the steel portion extends half-way into the strike solenoid. When it is at the end of the strike, about one inch is still in the retract solenoid. Stay tuned for more next week. **Who Knew?:** Deagan chimes founder John Deagan died 77 years ago on April 28, 1934. Happy Easter! (Questions? 202.244.4833)

### How Should We Speak To God?

In translating from one language to another, there is more than one way of saying the same thing. "Hey, pass the salt!" or "Would you pass me the salt, please?" are basically saying the same thing and will likely result in you receiving the salt shaker. But some ways of speaking are more appropriate for one context than another. We speak differently sitting with family around the kitchen table than we would at a formal dinner. Our current English translation has been criticized for being at times too "conversational." The new translation is meant to provide a more courteous, reverential way of praying the liturgy. It is God to whom we are speaking, not someone sitting next to us in class.

These upcoming changes in wording may be uncomfortable at first, since the current words come so automatically to our lips. But with use, we will become accustomed to the new words and phrases and in so doing, we will come to a deeper appreciation of what the church intends to say by them. We will come to a fuller participation in the mystery of the Eucharist we celebrate.
