## Readings • 6th Sunday Of Easter

### First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 8:5-8, 14-17

The Acts of the Apostles is the story of the spread of the faith. Philip brings the Gospel, and amazing things happen: demons are cast out, and the sick are healed. Great numbers are baptized and receive the Holy Spirit. It all begins with Philip's preaching and the crowd's "attention."

### Second Reading: 1 Peter 3:15-18

Today's reading from 1 Peter is full of good advice to Christians living in a hostile world. "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope," he tells them, "but do it with gentleness and reverence." The faith is not something to be forced on others. Instead, we treat those who do not share our hope with reverence. We are to be like Christ, who suffered for doing what was good.

### Gospel: John 14:15-21

The disciples do not understand how they can follow Jesus, how they can go where he is going. Jesus responds with the promise of the Advocate who will come to lead them more deeply into the mysterious relationship of Father and Son. Through the Holy Spirit, they will see Jesus again, for he promises to reveal himself to them.

## More From The Pastor's Desk ...

Dear Friends,

I recently met with the tenants of the apartment building directly to the right of our school and church as you enter the parking lot. They have issued a complaint! Oftentimes, our parishioners will actually park in their parking spaces or will block their access to leave their parking space during Sunday Masses, and sometimes during the Saturday evening Mass.

This is a very difficult situation for them. Some of the residents work in hospitals and need to be able to leave without the worry and concern of having access to their car or being blocked from the exit by the cars of our parishioners. I ask that everyone in the parish be very conscious of our neighbors who have been patient and good to us all these years.

Please do not park in the apartment building lot or block the tenants from exiting their parking lot. If you come to Mass and there is no place to park in our main lot, you are not allowed to park in the apartment building lot. That space is reserved for people who pay money on a yearly basis for the privilege of parking next to their home.

Secondly, if you come into the parking lot and realize the lot is blocked so that you can't park in our parking lot, you must either back out or go down the alley between the school and apartment building to Patterson Street and park on the street.

I am not anxious to have cars towed, but I've been asked to do so. If there isn't a marked improvement in this situation, I won't hesitate to have a car towed to make sure the tenants can leave their parking lot without any obstructions. PLEASE respect the rights of our apartment building neighbors, particularly during major events, i.e Sunday Masses, the school play and other events that bring numerous cars onto our campus.

Thank you for your cooperation. As in all things, I am thankful for all you do.

**Remembering Former Blessed Sacrament Priests** — Two weeks ago we remembered two priests who served at Blessed Sacrament for many years, many years ago. We honored Monsignor Smyth on Thursday evening, May 19, at the 5:30 p.m. Mass to thank the Lord for his ministry to Blessed Sacrament as our founding pastor. On May 16, I attended the funeral for Father George Reid who was an Associate Pastor here in the 1960s before he went to St. Mary's in Barnesville almost 40 years ago. He served as pastor of St. Mary Catholic Church for 32 years after serving our parish for almost a decade. Father Reid had a lot of personality and was thought of as a "character" in the best sense, but underneath he cared very deeply about people. May these two great giants of Blessed Sacrament rest in peace. —*Father John*

**Visit Your Parish Library**

The feast of the Visitation, marking Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth (Luke 1:39-57), was first celebrated (at the instigation of St. Bonaventure) by the Franciscans in 1253 and extended to the whole Church in 1389 'with the hope that Christ and his mother would visit the Church and put an end to the Great Schism which rent the seamless garment of Christ' ([www.newadvent.org/cathen/15480.htm](http://www.newadvent.org/cathen/15480.htm)). Gerard Manley Hopkins in a poem of 1883 wrote, 'our Lady mantles the guilty globe' and 'mothers each new grace that now does reach our race' (The Blessed Virgin Compared to the Air We Breathe). Consistently for Catholics the Blessed Virgin Mary is a source of 'solace, inspiration and strength'. Her mediation through many messages and world-wide apparitions give this feast of the Visitation a special resonance. Janice T. Connell, attorney, Dame of Malta and author, recently spoke to a group in the Duffy Parish Center about her experiences and books:

"Praying with Mary: Sacred Prayers to the Blessed Mother for all Occasions" (242.74 V762 P892). This moving anthology comes from many sources: liturgies, saints, Popes and Church councils. There are also unusual entries from literary sources such as Dante Alighieri and Rudyard Kipling. Each of the nine chapters has a theme from the litany of our Lady and informative introductions and Janice Connell has added personal anecdotes to the prayers.

"Queen of the Cosmos: Interviews with the Visionaries of Medjugorje" (234.6 C655 Q822). Father Robert Faricy, S.J., an American priest and then professor at the Gregorian University, gives the background to the miraculous events in what was then central Yugoslavia under communist rule. Describing the appearance of our Lady first to two young girls and then to six children, Janice Connell interviewed the children and later returned to Medjugorje to verify the accuracy of her transcripts.

"The Visions of the Children" (234.6 C655 V474). This book describes the reasons for Janice Connell's initial pilgrimage to Medjugorje with her family, which included her four children, and their moving experiences during their stay. The author continues with searching interviews with the young people who received our Lady's messages; the latter are transcribed in the last chapter of the book.

**Chimes Chatter** — Why a Crucifix outside our chimes bell tower? Christian use of the cross did not begin until Emperor

Constantine (312 A.D.), after victorious battle, adopted the cross as the prime Christian symbol, marking Constantine's beginning conversion to Christianity. This Milvian Bridge battle (outside of Rome), where in a dream, a vision of God promised Constantine victory if soldiers daubed the sign of the cross on their shields. Subsequently at Council of Nicaea (323 A.D.), Constantine decreed the Cross as the symbol of the Crucifixion and official symbol of Christianity. In a 1928 local article of "The Review," readers' answered that a more prominent place be given the cross in the Catholic Church (additionally to steeple pinnacles). Suggestions included the cross be placed so as to greet worshippers upon their very entrance into church. One reader even elected that the cross bearing the Crucified Savior, be placed outside the church, so that Catholic and non-Catholic passing by might be inspired. Msgr. Smyth and architects Maginnis and Walsh, skillfully accomplished this with the Crucifix of the Redeemer of Mankind sculpted upon our bell tower walls, completing an atmosphere of piety inside and outside the edifice.
