Psalm 33: 6

By the LORD'S word the heavens were made; by the breath of his mouth all their host.

Prov 8:22-31

- 22 "The LORD begot me, the first-born of his ways, the forerunner of his prodigies of long ago;
- 23 From of old I was poured forth, at the first, before the earth.
- 24 When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no fountains or springs of water;
- 25 Before the mountains were settled into place, before the hills, I was brought forth;
- 26 While as yet the earth and the fields were not made, nor the first clods of the world.
- 27 "When he established the heavens I was there, when he marked out the vault over the face of the deep;
- 28 When he made firm the skies above, when he fixed fast the foundations of the earth;
- 29 When he set for the sea its limit, so that the waters should not transgress his command;
- 30 Then was I beside him as his craftsman, and I was his delight day by day, Playing before him all the while,
- 31 playing on the surface of his earth; and I found delight in the sons of men.

Wis 7:22-25

- 22 for Wisdom, the artificer of all, taught me. For in her is a spirit intelligent, holy, unique, Manifold, subtle, agile, clear, unstained, certain, Not baneful, loving the good, keen, unhampered, beneficent,
- 23 kindly, Firm, secure, tranquil, all-powerful, all-seeing, And pervading all spirits, though they be intelligent, pure and very subtle.
- 24 For Wisdom is mobile beyond all motion, and she penetrates and pervades all things by reason of her purity.
- 25 For she is an aura of the might of God and a pure effusion of the glory of the Almighty; therefore nought that is sullied enters into her.

Wis 8:5 And if riches be a desirable possession in life, what is more rich than Wisdom, who produces all things?

Wis 9:1, 9-11

- 1 God of my fathers, LORD of mercy. you who have made all things by your word
- 9 Now with you is Wisdom, who knows your works and was present when you made the world; Who understands what is pleasing in your eyes and what is

- 10 Send her forth from your holy heavens and from your glorious throne dispatch her That she may be with me and work with me, that I may know what is your pleasure.
- 11 For she knows and understands all things, and will guide me discreetly in my affairs and safeguard me by her glory;

Question 11

Mark 9:11-13

- 11 Then they asked him, "Why do the scribes say that Elijah must come first?"
- 12 He told them, "Elijah will indeed come first and restore all things, yet how is it written regarding the Son of Man that he must suffer greatly and be treated with contempt?"
- 13 But I tell you that Elijah has come and they did to him whatever they pleased, as it is written of him."

Question 14

Mark 1:16-20

- 16 \_\_\_ As he passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen.
- 17 Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men."
- 18 Then they abandoned their nets and followed him.
- 19 He walked along a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They too were in a boat mending their nets.
- 20 Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him.

Matt 4:18-22

- 18 As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen.
- 19 He said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men."
- 20 At once they left their nets and followed him.
- 21 He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat, with their father Zebedee, mending their nets. He called them,
- 22 and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him.

Luke 5:1-11

- 1 \_\_\_ While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret.
- 2 He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets.
- 3 Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.
- 4 After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch."
- 5 Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets."

- 6 When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing.
- 7 They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that they were in danger of sinking.
- 8 When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man."
- 9 For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him,
- 10 and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men."
- 11 When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything 2 and followed him.

### Question 18

Gen 28:10-19

- 10 Jacob departed from Beer-sheba and proceeded toward Haran.
- 11 \_\_\_ When he came upon a certain shrine, as the sun had already set, he stopped there for the night. Taking one of the stones at the shrine, he put it under his head and lay down to sleep at that spot.
- 12 Then he had a dream: a stairway rested on the ground, with its top reaching to the heavens; and God's messengers were going up and down on it.
- 13 And there was the LORD standing beside him and saying: "I, the LORD, am the God of your forefather Abraham and the God of Isaac; the land on which you are lying I will give to you and your descendants.
- 14 These shall be as plentiful as the dust of the earth, and through them you shall spread out east and west, north and south. In you and your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing.
- 15 Know that I am with you; I will protect you wherever you go, and bring you back to this land. I will never leave you until I have done what I promised you."
- 16 When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he exclaimed, "Truly, the LORD is in this spot, although I did not know it!"
- 17 \_\_\_ In solemn wonder he cried out: "How awesome is this shrine! This is nothing else but an abode of God, and that is the gateway to heaven!"
- 18 Early the next morning Jacob took the stone that he had put under his head, set it up as a memorial stone, and poured oil on top of it.
- 19 He called that site Bethel, whereas the former name of the town had been Luz.

Gen 32:25-31

- 25 \_\_\_ Jacob was left there alone. Then some man wrestled with him until the break of dawn.
- 26 When the man saw that he could not prevail over him, he struck Jacob's hip at its socket, so that the hip socket was wrenched as they wrestled.
- 27 The man then said, "Let me go, for it is daybreak." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go until you bless me."
- 28 "What is your name?" the man asked. He answered, "Jacob."
- 29 Then the man said, "You shall no longer be spoken of as Jacob, but as Israel,

- because you have contended with divine and human beings and have prevailed."
- 30 Jacob then asked him, "Do tell me your name, please." He answered, "Why should you want to know my name?" With that, he bade him farewell.
- 31 Jacob named the place Peniel, "Because I have seen God face to face," he said, "yet my life has been spared."

Question 5

Matt 21:12-13

- 12 Jesus entered the temple area and drove out all those engaged in selling and buying there. He overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who were selling doves.
- 13 And he said to them, "It is written: 'My house shall be a house of prayer,' but you are making it a den of thieves."

Mark 11:15-17

- 15 They came to Jerusalem, and on entering the temple area he began to drive out those selling and buying there. He overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who were selling doves.
- 16 He did not permit anyone to carry anything through the temple area.
- 17 Then he taught them saying, "Is it not written: 'My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples'? But you have made it a den of thieves."

Luke 19:45-46

- 45 Then Jesus entered the temple area [11](#) and proceeded to drive out those who were selling things,
- 46 saying to them, "It is written, 'My house shall be a house of prayer, but you have made it a den of thieves.'"
